Family Unification Program

Special purpose Housing Choice Voucher program administered by a Public Housing Authority (PHA), in partnership with Public Child Welfare Agency (PCWA) and Continuum of Care (CoC).

FUP is designed to serve:

Families for whom the lack of adequate housing is a primary factor in:

- The imminent placement of the family's child or children in out-of-home care, OR -
- The delay in the discharge of the child or children to the family from out-of-home care.



- Left foster care at age 16 or older, or will leave foster care within 90 days, and
- Is currently or at risk of experiencing homelessness.



Foster Youth to Independence

Special purpose Housing Choice Voucher program administered by a Public Housing Authority (PHA), in partnership with Public Child Welfare Agency (PCWA) and other entities such as Continuum of Care (CoC).

FYI is designed to serve youth/young adults ages 18-24 who:

Left foster care at age 16 or older, or will leave foster care within 90 days, and
 Is currently or at risk of experiencing homelessness.







Identifying Families and Young Adults

Questions to Identify & Screen for Housing Stability

- Are you interested in housing resources and support?
- Would you like to be referred for housing resources and supports?
- Are you concerned about your housing?

Refer and Connect to Housing Resources

- Simplify housing resources without overburdening agency or organization
- Provide immediate connection to community housing resources
- Address range of needs from currently homeless to housing stability barriers

Community Resource Mapping

- Identify several real and common situations then brainstorm all the possible resources and referrals you would make for that person.
- Write down all the possible responses. Include web addresses. Don't worry about duplication.
- Repeat with different groups.


